# A Message from the Spackenkill Superintendent



## One District, Multiple Paths to Excellence

December 4, 2020

Dear Spackenkill Community,

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving break.

Last week, we communicated that our region is seeing a rapid rise in confirmed cases of COVID-19. This was a hot topic at a county superintendents' meeting with the Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health (DBCH) this past Wednesday. DBCH confirmed that the data shows it's not the schools that are hotspots for transmission. Small gatherings and community spread are the main issue. DBCH supports us in continuing in-person instruction. The Governor is focused on keeping students in the classroom as a long-term goal, and we will do everything in our power to make that happen safely.

Here is an excerpt from Governor Cuomo's strategy outlined in his Winter Plan:

One of the most critical aspects of managing the COVID-19 pandemic for governments and parents alike has been answering the question of how and when schools should remain open. On that point, experts from around the globe have determined that as long as a school's infection rate is under control and remains under the infection rate of the community at large, schools should remain open, particularly for students in K-8.

We also wanted to let you know that instead of sending out an email and filling up your in-box every time an individual tests positive but instruction remains in person, we are asking you to check the <a href="New York Forward COVID-19 School Report Card">New York Forward COVID-19 School Report Card</a> for updates on individuals testing positive. We will also update the community in this newsletter every Friday. Despite the frequency of these emails, only once has a positive test resulted in a school having to go fully remote, and in most cases, the individuals were off-premises. New York State requires us to report positive cases even when the individual is not actually on site. Please note that our main reason for going fully remote relates to staffing. If staff must quarantine, then we might not have enough personnel to support in-person attendance. Going forward, you will only receive COVID notifications by SchoolMessenger communication if a building must operate on a fully remote schedule.

It is our hope that we can continue on an uninterrupted schedule until the holiday break, which begins on **December 23** (this is a change from the previous calendar, as we have added one day in the likelihood that we won't have to use as many snow days as in the past). Following the holiday break and as conditions evolve, we will reassess our plans for in-person and remote learning.


#### **Club Celebrates National French Week**
